About 5 days ago without any known cause she became restless, and uninterested performed her duties indifferently, and talked somewhat strangely. She has since become much more bed-ridden, and for the last two days has been very restless, unable to do any work, and so stupid that she has been dressed, and forced to sit the refusing to speak or take any notice when spoken to. stiffness in body and limbs, will not walk or move and has been forced to be carried from place to place. She refuses her food and drink being fed. She is helpless at night, but has not yet been either dirty or delirious. There is every reason to believe that drink is the cause of the attack.

ON ADMISSION

Mind. Refuses to speak and disregards what is said to her. There was great stiffness of limbs & body. She hardly refuses to walk & objects being carried. Body. Well nourished and she is apparently free from any organic disease.

Was in a very excited state when admitted, throwing herself about, stiffness limbs and body, would not speak and took no notice whatever when spoken to & refused to eat a morsel. She resisted forcibly attempts made to dress her so was put to bed where she lay quiet, but would not take anything or speak and when backed stiffened her limbs in the most peculiar way. During the night she was quiet but did not sleep at all. To day she has remained in bed, and seems rather more rational but she will not speak. She has however taken a small quantity of nourishment.

Left bed last night but continues in the same stupid state and remains in bed away from maternal. Left well last night and this morning when asked the answer to questions and spoke fairly rationally. She is quiet and has taken her meals well. But she has a stupid confused look and is unable to display energy, but she assisted herself in dressing.

Left well last night and this morning she does not help herself to breakfast and made herself useful washing up. She speaks when spoken to and appears to conduct herself rationally.

Now helps well, talks sensibly, takes all her meals and makes herself useful sewing, & cleaning. She now comes rational in every way, and is regularly employed in the kitchen where she makes herself very useful.

Attempts to be usefully employed in the kitchen and her mental condition is now very satisfactory. She suffers however from neuralgia and for this she is at present under treatment.

Her mental condition continues satisfactory she is daily employed in the kitchen, and since she has been under treatment suffers less from neuralgia.
