CAUSATION Predisposing
 Exciting
 Hereditary *Great Aunt's Insane.*

DURATION *6 months*
 Six months ago she was married, and within a few days after marriage she became depressed and very unnatural in her manners. She showed great dislike to her husband and he after trying with his peculiar treatment for a time deserted her and has not since been heard of. Her depression followed her employment, under guidance, and 3 weeks ago when she became restless and irritable and in this state she has since remained. During the last week she has been uncontrollable she has had very little sleep, and has talked almost incessantly in the most rambling and incoherent way, saying that she has annoyed people and that she was going to be married again. He is destructive and inclined to be violent.

ON ADMISSION Mind In a very excited state, shouting, singing and talking in the most incoherent way.
 Body She is highly degenerated a large piece of left lobe having *meninges* been removed by necrosis. She is thin and delicate looking, she has a harsh dry cough and her *supra-orbital* *sinus* *over* apex of left lung is thick.

18th She was excited restless and very noisy when admitted and did not sleep much during the night for she sang until morning. She had to be dressed washed &c this morning and since she has been up she has been very excited shouting and talking in the most frolicsome way. She has so far taken all her food and her habits are cleanly.

19th She is restless and talkative being incoherent in her conversation and very flighty speaking about &c. She is noisy at night but so far her habits have been cleanly and she takes her meals willingly.

17th She sleeps better but in other respects there is no improvement whatever for she is constantly talking in a rambling incoherent way. She is perverse and makes use of very objectionable language. She takes her meals well and is cleanly in her habits.

18th Is rather inclined to be noisy at night but in the whole she sleeps better than she did. She is restless and talkative does not employ herself in any way but spends the day wandering about the house and addresses herself and is more tractable than she was but is frequently abusive &c without any provocation, and she then makes use of most objectionable language. She takes all her meals well.

19th Continues in much the same unsettled state and is always talking and very seldom still for many minutes together she sleeps much better at night and takes all her meals well.

20th She is quieter than she was and now employs herself to some extent at needlework she is also less boisterous and not so quarrelsome but at times she is still however *abundant* tractable.

21st She has now considerably improved for she is quiet talks rationally and not in the voluble way that

She did. He employs herself regularly at needle-work and in consequence of this satisfactory change she has been transferred to No. 6. She sleeps well takes all her meals and looks a very much better plight than she did.

January 3rd 1863.

Her condition seems now to be in every way normal for she is quiet and undisturbed. She sleeps peacefully and sleeps well at night. Should her unsatisfactory change in her condition take place she will be discharged at the end of the month. She now appears quite well in every way so has been discharged as "Recovered".
Wright got well.
