DURATION

Hereditary His mother was a patient here about eight years ago.

For the past two years he has been much addicted to drink, and in consequence he has neglected his business, taken to wandering about and become unsettled in his mind. Owing to his intemperate habits he has become straitened in money matters and this has preyed upon him especially during the last fortnight so that he has been very low spirited. He seeks solace and on two occasions has attempted suicide by jumping into a pit, and would have succeeded in his object two days ago had he not been promptly rescued by some people who watched his movements. He has engaged several men to look after him & toward them he has shown violence when opposed. He sleeps very little, but takes his food well. Memory is affected. Body In fairly good plight. Heart and lungs healthy.

Has had only a few hours sleep each night since admission, and seems to be slightly more depressed and to feel his position keenly. He converses sensibly and rationally, and is free from excitement. His appetite is fairly good; circulation is feeble and he complains greatly of cold.

4<sup>th</sup> Bowels were confined but now freely open and he expresses himself as feeling better but he is liable to alter from day to day. Takes 1/2 gr. Morph. h. s. Conversation rational and quiet, gives no trouble and appetite good. Commenced to do gardening on the female side after dark age. Very quiet and well conducted. Manner somewhat more cheerful.

He is not so low spirited, but appears to be very hypochondriacal and is much alarmed about the state of his stomach and bowels. He suffers from constipation and takes a dinner pill daily. Continues to go to work. Appetite good the does not complain of sleeplessness.

18<sup>th</sup> Manner is more cheerful, he converses rationally and does not dwell upon his ailments. Goes to work regularly. Sleeps well and takes his meals heartily.

His mental condition appears in every respect to be natural. He is cheerful, contented and rational. Works industriously on the female side. If he continues in the same satisfactory state he will be discharged at the Committee Meeting at the end of this month.
