He has been suffering from Erysipelas for several weeks and three weeks ago he became excited in his manner and violent in his conduct but his being sent to an Asylum has been delayed on account of ill health. His nights have been sleepless and he has refused his food, but has improved in both respects during the past day or two. He talks incessantly and as a rule incoherently. He is naturally a quiet and reserved person, but his manner is wholly changed. For several years back he has been somewhat eccentric, and used to spend hours in the morning praying, and then sit up the greater part of the night.

ON ADMISSION

Mind *Excited look. Gesticulating and talking quickly and in an excited manner.*

Body *Pale and anæmic. Face and ears discoloured. Mucous healthy, heart's action very rapid.*

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Feb. 22nd

Since admission he has been very talkative saying he will bring an action against medical man who sent him. Some of his remarks are very absurd. Takes all his meals heartily and rests quietly by night. Got slightly excited when talking. Habits good.

24th

More subdued in his manners, but still talkative and peculiar. Makes a great ^{man} promise to attend suits &c. Takes his food well and has slept the greater part of every night since admission.

March 15th

Has progressed steadily, during the past fortnight. His mind now appears to be tolerably clear. He talks rationally and is free from excitement. He is cheerful and obliging and appears to be a man of more than ordinary intelligence. He has been removed to the Auxiliary Asylum. He makes himself useful in the ward. He has gained flesh and looks much healthier of late.

April 18th

His mental condition now appears to be in every respect satisfactory. His general health has improved considerably since he was admitted. At the Committee meeting at the end of this month - he will be discharged.

April 24th

He left the Asylum to-day "Recovered"
